## World Water Day (22 March 2024)



**Make every drop count!**

Water is a scarce and precious resource as Singapore's population expands. Every little effort adds up to make a big difference. In alignment to this year's theme "Save Water. Big ways, small ways. All OK!", the taps at the MTS canteen were turned off during recesses. The children did their part by washing their hands and utensils with assistance from PATH members using rationed water.





# Mother Tongue Fortnight (2-3 April 2024)



The Mother Tongue Fortnight activities provided an engaging platform for students to delve into the richness of their mother tongue languages. With 10 activity booths offering diverse experiences, students explored the history, culture and theory of the languages.



One highlight was the exploration of Chinese characters' evolution from hieroglyphs to modern forms, sparking curiosity among students. Chinese idioms are widely used in the language. So, the students explored the various idioms through a picture-matching game. Additionally, the Malay culture was showcased through traditional games like Main Lereng and Ting Ting, adding a playful dimension to language exploration. The Malay language was also explored through games like word domino and picture-word matching.



Through meticulously planned activities, the event succeeded in making language learning enjoyable and meaningful, fostering a deeper appreciation for students' mother tongue languages. It was an amazing experience for students to understand their own mother tongue language and explore another mother tongue language.





# International Friendship Day (4-5 April 2024)



PATH members assisted with running the 3 stations - Kahoot, wristband and traditional dance. Kahoot proved to be the most popular station, as students answered a quiz which tested their knowledge of other countries and cultures.

At the wristband station, students wrote their selected greetings commonly used in Southeast Asia. Over at the traditional dance station, the students had great fun learning the basics steps of each Southeast Asian country's dance. At the end of each activity, students received a traditional toy to connect their friendship with others through traditional games.





## P4 and P6 NAPFA Run (29 April-16 May 2024)

PATH members were deployed to enhance the safety of P4 and P6 students who took part in the 1.6km run as part of the National Physical Fitness Award. Stationed at different check points of the running route, PATH members also cheered for and encouraged the students to run their best.





## Green Day (13-15 May 2024)



We are delighted to share the success of the MTS Green Campaign, held on Monday, 13 May 2024 to Wednesday, 15 May 2024, with the theme "Environment Care Begins with Me." The active participation and enthusiasm of our students have truly made this event a memorable one.



As part of MTS Green Day, students were encouraged to wear a GREEN top along with school PE shorts to show their support for environmental awareness. PATH members played a vital role in running three engaging booths. These booths featured a Kahoot quiz, a platform for creating personal messages on a Padlet wall, and NEA exhibition games. Students' responses to these activities were overwhelmingly positive, demonstrating their eagerness to learn and engage in activities related to saving our Mother Earth.



Additionally, every Wednesday, the school hosts a collection of recyclable materials, with three dedicated PATH members assisting at the school recycling stations. This regular event reinforces our school's commitment in promoting sustainable practices and responsible waste management.



The NEA exhibition games focused on important environmental issues, such as preventing mosquito breeding at home and reducing food waste. 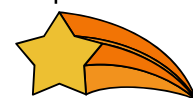
